Greetings Olds United Church friends in faith,

It has been a different kind of summer for most of us, however I hope you have all found moments of rest and renewal, for both body and spirit. As we look ahead to returning to worship at the church, I wanted to let you know what things will look like as we move into the next stage of COVID 19 guidelines.



As schools resume, I know that for our families, there are difficult decisions to be made around sending your children, having them do on-line learning, or home-schooling. There are a lot of unknowns in that, and as a community of faith, we hold teachers, students and parents, administration, and support staff in our prayers.

In the church, there will be some who have similar struggles around the decision to come to worship. I know there are some among us who live with compromised immune systems, or who have family members that live with higher risk factors. For some, joining us for worship may not be possible yet. And those folks, too, are in our prayers. Dr. Deena Hinshaw, with AHS reminds us that there is an age factor in determining risk levels, and she recommends that those over 65 carefully consider participation in large group activities. So, for those who decide it's not yet practical or safe to return to church, we understand, and we hold them in prayer.

With all that in mind, our plan is to resume in-person worship on September 13. In keeping with Alberta Health Services (AHS) and United Church guidelines, it is strongly suggested that we limit our indoor gathering time to less than our usual hour, so I will endeavour to offer worship of 40 to 45 minutes maximum.



When you arrive, please enter through the open door, either the main south door or north parking lot (accessible) door, minding the distance between your family/cohort/bubble and the people ahead of you and behind you. Please maintain that 2 metre distance.

You will be greeted in the entry way and asked to complete a screening form – basically a health self-assessment, modeled after what AHS uses, and you will be asked to use hand sanitizer and wear a mask while moving about the building. Those forms will be kept for 2 weeks, in the safe, and only referred to if we have a case of COVID and they are needed for contact tracing. They will not leave the church. After 2 weeks, they will be shredded.

Also, we will have some masks available, however you are welcome to bring your own reusable ones.

**Masks are required to be worn whenever you are walking around in the building, and you are strongly encouraged to keep them on when seated.**

As you enter the hall, please be seated, filling spaces furthest from the doors (east side) to closest (west side), with households /cohorts/bubbles sitting together, and maintaining 2 metre distance between

tables/seats. With the new rental arrangement with Redemption Church, we will use the hall for the first while, until we establish routines. This will also make cleaning following worship a less rushed process.

Once you are seated you may remove your mask, but you will be expected to put it on again if you leave your seat or if you are visiting with others from outside your household, before or after worship begins.

For the first while, we will not be having Sunday School. Children are welcome to be with us for the whole of worship. I am trying to determine how I will do the time for children in a socially distant way, so please, also bring some quiet activities, books, etc. for your children, as we will not have our toys out for sanitation reasons.

For offering, we will not be passing the plate, and will ask you to place your gifts to the church in the offering plate at the entryways.

Should you need to use the washroom please wash thoroughly, and then use the sanitizer wipes provided, on the taps and door handle. Whenever possible, please try to maintain 1 person in the washroom at a time. We also will avoid using the downstairs washrooms, as the Joyfully His Preschool and Girl Guides will be using those.



We will NOT be singing. We will listen to hymns played and you may hum, however if you do so, it would be preferred that you wear your mask.

It has been strongly advised that we NOT celebrate communion yet. It has been a very long time since we have done so, however food / beverage handling is high risk, and it is very difficult to maintain social distance while serving. You are welcome to bring your coffee or tea in your travel mug.

Following worship, you will be asked to leave in order, closest to the doors first, masks on. There will be no coffee time, and you are encouraged to leave the building directly after worship.

I need to be honest and tell you this will not be the church experience you had hoped we would be returning to. It's not what I imagined we'd be returning to, either. There is a sense of grief around that. We are not alone in that. Every faith community has been struggling with this. The most important factor in how we return is the well-being of all, and that we do our utmost to maintain a safe environment for everyone who comes into our building.

I will continue to post my sermon to the website for those who are not ready to return to in-person worship, and we are hoping to video record the weekly worship in either Olds or Sundre, once we resolve our technical difficulties.

As we plan that opening day – it is important that we have volunteers to be greeters at the front and back entrances to the church, receiving the health form, etc. and directing people to their seats.

We will need **4 greeters** (2 for each entrance). We will also need **2 people to clean tables and chair backs**, immediately following worship, and **2 people to clean the upper hall washrooms**.
